Warner's Pond Task Force

Proposals (costs still TBD)

- Dam Removal - enhancements including trails, piers, limited dredging, bridges
- Dredging - 35,000 - 100,000 cy dredged to north field
- Limited Action - drawdown, diver assisted invasive removal

The Task Force is evaluating a fish ladder

Knowledge, Attitudes, and Practices (KAP), which is a quantitative method (predefined questions formatted in standardized questionnaires) that provides access to quantitative and qualitative information. 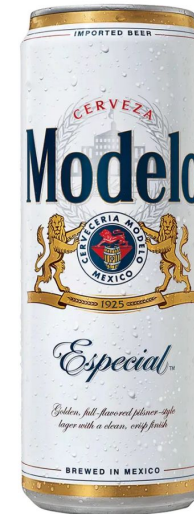
